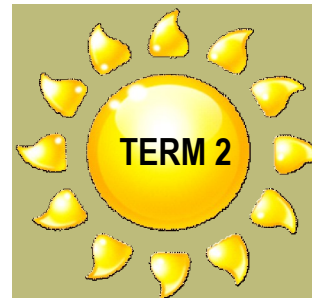

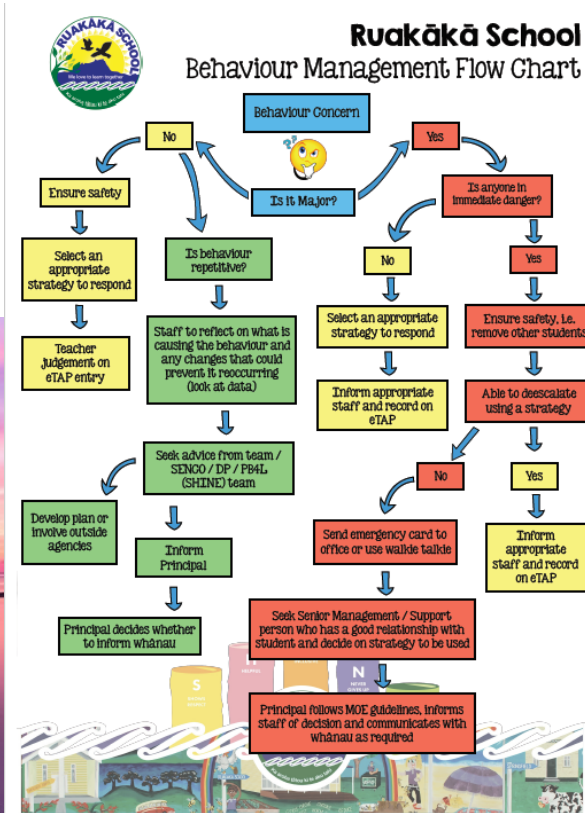
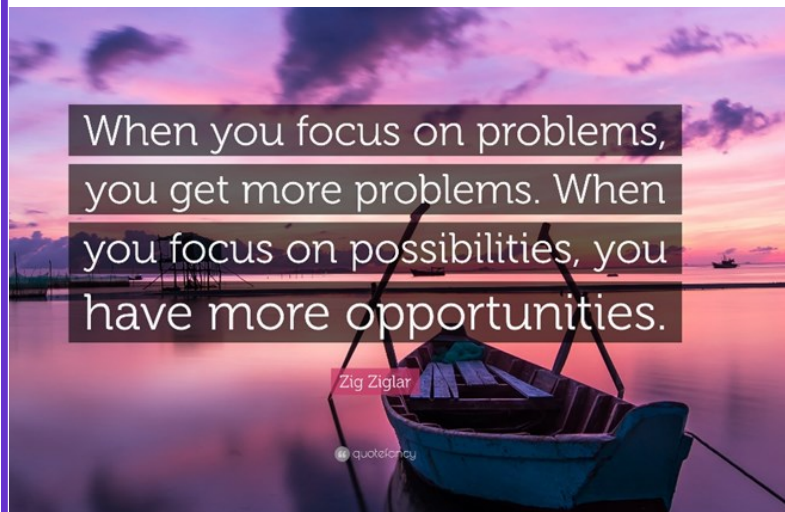

PARENT SURVEYS

Thank you so much to all of you who filled out the Parent Survey at the interviews. We love to get your feedback as it often influences future directions for the school.

The majority were just so positive about our school which was great.

Most of you felt that the way you would like information sent to you was through emails, text messages, Seesaw messages, and the Facebook page. There was only one negative comment about Seesaw.

The only other mixed feedback was about our new lunch scheme. Some of you felt that it was too expensive, others thought it was great. The numbers of families using it are slowly increasing - I guess if we don't use it, we will lose it. I will make sure the information is available in the office area for you.

There was very positive feedback about our inclusive culture and the opportunities Ruakaka School gives all of our children – particularly those involved in our bilingual programme. We are privileged to have such a team of dedicated teachers to ensure this happens throughout the school. At times our bilingual teachers may be away due to sickness or to attend professional development. Relieving teachers are difficult to find at the moment and so we cannot always find a reliever with the same level of Te Reo as our bilingual teachers, but they bring different experiences for our tamariki.

We recently had a visit from the Ministry of Education Māori Language Resourcing team and their report was excellent. Here is just one of the positive comments they made about our school:

"In terms of Māori immersion the school has been very sensitive and sensible and inclusive in the manner in which it has approached the growth and development of this very important facet of Aotearoa and local iwi identity, language and culture. For this everyone associated with the school deserves credit. You are all playing an important part of ensuring that te reo Māori is firstly retained, then maintained and over time enhanced. This all adds to the fabric of our Aotearoa society as a whole."

WOOD OFF-CUTS
