Paid Union Meeting

On **Tuesday 28th of February** most of our teaching staff will be attending a paid union meeting in Whangarei. All tamariki will be given a packed lunch to bring home to eat on that day to save you feeding them when they get home. If you are unable to find care for your tamariki for the afternoon, please contact the office and we will supervise them until 2.30pm when you will need to pick them up as there will be no buses running at 2.30. If your tamariki already attend After School care, this will still be available on this day.

Teacher Only Days

As some of you may know, the New Zealand Curriculum has been reviewed and as a result of this, teachers need time to become familiar with these changes. For this reason, the Ministry of Education has allocated two Teacher Only Days for both 2023 and 2024 to do this. The first one has to be held within the first two weeks of Term 2 this year. The schools in the Bream Bay area have agreed to hold this on **Friday, the 5th of May**. Please note this on your calendar.

On **Tuesday the 6th of June**, the day after Kings Birthday, we will be holding another Teacher Only Day which will be a mini conference for the Bream Bay Kahui Ako. We understand two Teacher Only Days in a term is unusual, but unfortunately is unavoidable. We apologise for the inconvenience this may cause, but maybe this is a great opportunity to book a long weekend away.

New Caretaker

We farewelled Aaron Therkleson at the end of last year and we now have a new caretaker - Jimmy Shirkey. Jimmy started with us on the 9th of January and had the school beautifully presented to start the new year.



Parking / Buses
