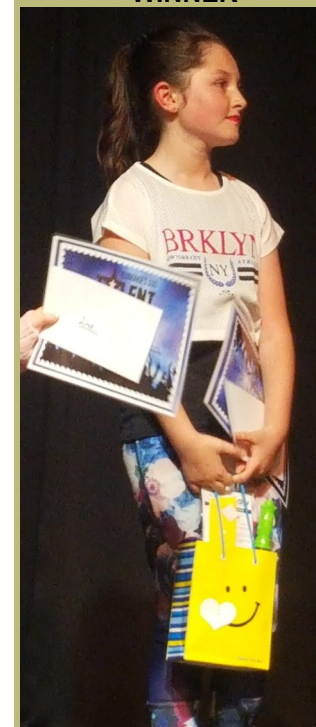

SHOW DAY

As part of our Positive Behaviour for Learning programme we are focussing on bus behaviour and what the expectations are when travelling on our buses. It has come to my attention on more than one occasion that some of our tamariki are not doing the right thing on the buses – and particularly on the Village bus. The children are expected to sit down for the trip – only standing when the bus has stopped if they are getting off, keep the noise down – and get home. There has also been reports of tamariki teasing other children, throwing things around, and we had a close call when a child was out of their seat before the bus stopped and actually fell on the steps – thankfully the door was still closed. We really need your help to reinforce expected behaviours on the bus – for your tamariki's safety.

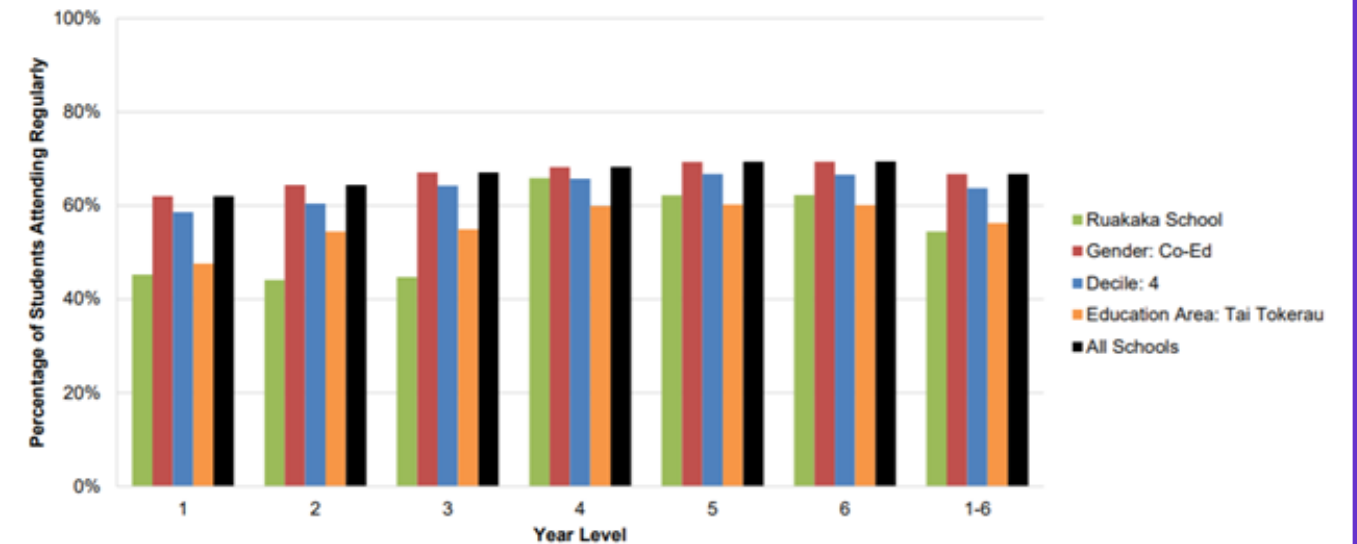
ATTENDANCE

At least once a year we are asked to send all of our attendance data into the Ministry so that they can track how our school is going compared to other schools. We received that report back this week and I must say, I was really disappointed with our results.

The attendance of our tamariki is well below where it should be for our tamariki to progress with their learning. I have included the graph below to show you where our attendance sits compared to other schools. We are the green line. It is just so important that our tamariki attend school every day when they are not sick. How much do we value our tamariki's education?

Attendance Comparisons by Year Level (Term 2, 2016)

This graph shows how student attendance at your school compares to similar schools by year level.



The percentage of Year 4 students (your highest-attending group) attending regularly was greater in your school than in the decile and education area comparison groups.

*Attending regularly is attending over 90% of half-days.

* A comparison by school type is not provided, as school types are typically based on the year levels of students attending the school.
